

Together, let's block the Dubé reform



- Bill 15 is inspired by a similar project carried out in Alberta in 2009, which means it's getting off to a bad start.
- The Alberta system is more expensive and has a higher hospital mortality ratio.
- If we want to carry out a wide-ranging reform of our health and social service system, we need to look elsewhere for inspiration.

A DEMOCRATIC DEFICIT

- Bill 15 wants to merge all local bargaining units, directly threatening each person's right to choose the union that will represent them.
- By weakening democratic power in the health and social service system, Bill 15 is getting off to a bad start.
- Our voices must be heard. The APTS
 wants employees to be present at every
 level where decisions are made in the
 health and social service system.

LABOUR RELATIONS

- The government says it wants to eliminate local collective agreements – which means it's denying and ignoring regional differences.
- By changing the bargaining model for collective agreements without prior consultation, Bill 15 is getting off to a bad start.
- Another reform of the governance of our health and social service system means we're putting off ensuring the use of best practices in occupational health and safety.

CENTRALIZATION

- The Dubé reform is largely based on an idea once put forward by Gaétan Barrette: concentrating power in fewer hands.
- Creating a gigantic new structure such as Santé Québec will make local management more difficult by adding an extra level of bureaucracy.
- Bill 15 is getting off to a bad start by making the health and social service system even more centralized.

PRIVATIZATION

- The private sector is hungry for financial resources that will enable it to perform acts similar to those carried out in the public system.
- Bill 15 is getting off to a bad start by acting as a Trojan horse for the private sector.
- The APTS says that all health care and social services should be nationalized so that all Quebecers are guaranteed access.
